

CIBC Chair in Human Capital and Productivity

The CIBC Chair in Human Capital and Productivity was established through a donation from the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce to support empirical, theoretical and policy-oriented investigation of the relationship between human capital and productivity in the Department of Economics at The University of Western Ontario. In addition to research, the responsibilities of the CIBC Chair will include related graduate student supervision and teaching. The CIBC Chair will serve as the coordinator for the CIBC Centre in Human Capital and Productivity. He/she will report to the Chair of the Department of Economics.

Applications and nominations are invited for appointment to the CIBC Chair in Human Capital and Productivity for a five-year term (non-renewable). The appointee must hold an existing tenured position in the Department of Economics at Western. The successful candidate will have a proven record of research and scholarship, and should already have gained a significant reputation in academic circles.

Applications and nominations, including curriculum vitae, should be forwarded to Professor Julie McMullin, Chair, CIBC Selection Committee, Dean's Office, Faculty of Social Science. The deadline for submissions is March 30, 2010.

Please note that the CIBC Chair holder may not hold a fellowship from the CIBC program concurrently.
