## **Additional Notes:**

- NSERC requires additional information to assess the researcher and contributions to the training of highly qualified personnel. In your funding application, you will be asked to provide:
- your most significant contributions to research and/or to practical applications;
- additional details on the contributions listed in your CCV; and
- clarification on your contributions to the training of highly qualified personnel.
- Letters of support: In the full application, you will be able to append letters from users attesting to the nature and the significance of confidential technical and internal reports described in your NSERC CCV.
- Use an asterisk (\*) within the CCV to denote students and HQP.
- Funding/Grant or Journal review committee membership should go into 'Committee Membership.'
- Once you submit and receive a confirmation code, download the .xml version of your CCV from the "History" tab. Use this file to upload to NSERC's Portal.
